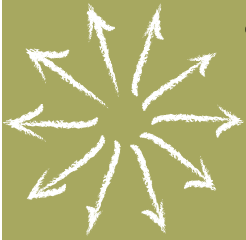


ENCHANTING LEARNING CHALLENGES

S - Slithering snakes
in Singapore.

- Using the 'S' card and the yellow section, find out as many facts as you can about Singapore and create a fact file.
- Write 10 alliteration rhymes (like the one on the card) using the 'S' sound.



- Draw a mind map and write as many describing words (adjectives) for the snake as you can...include ideas about the snake's personality as well as how it looks!
- Try to think of 10 similes for the snake.
E.g. As sly as a ... Green like a ...
- Use your ideas to write a paragraph describing the snake; use as much detail as you can.

IMPORTANT!

Try to keep your writing neat so you can re-read it easily!

This snake will lead you to wherever you most desire...

Ask a friend to say as many 'desirable' places they can think of and write them down as they say them. Add to the list with places you would like to visit and then grade them with stars - 3 stars for an awesome place down to 1 star for a place you would least like to visit.

STORYTELLING

Use the work you have done so far to tell a short story using the story starter in the red section. Make a voice note or record yourself on camera telling the story. Don't worry if you make mistakes and change your mind.

Watch or listen back and then try to write the story on some lined paper.

TOP TIP

Use all the description you have planned, to add lots of detail about the characters in your story and the places they visit. Paint a picture in your reader's mind!
